Action Requested:

- Successfully closed extended FY 2020 filing window with no technical issues
- Completed RHC systems and operational assessment

RFP	Request for Proposal	A document that solicits a proposal, often made through a bidding process, by a company interested in procurement of a commodity or service to potential suppliers to submit business proposals. It is submitted early in the procurement cycle.
RHC	RHC Rural Health Care Division An organization within USAC with the mission to administer the HCF and Telecom programs, as well as any FCC portion or directives impacting rural healthcare.	
sow	Statement of Work	A portion of the RFP that describes the work that will be taking place.

Rural Health Care Business Update Q2 2020 Update on Rural Health Care Administration

Overall Summary for Q2 2020:

The Rural Health Care (RHC) Division had a very strong second quarter, which focused on the rollout of Reform Order changes, operational efficiency, and program integrity. RHC achieved all major program milestones on time, despite continuing to work remotely. The RHC Division continued issuing both single year commitments and multi-year/upfront commitments for FY 2019 for all eligible amounts requested (i.e., without proration). The FCC issued DA 20-697, which provided guidance to USAC on how to implement the FCC directive in FCC Report and Order 19-78 (Reform Order) to establish a database of rural and urban rates, which was subsequently launched at the end of the quarter. The RHC Division also made significant progress toward implementing the Reform Order by deploying changes to My Portal and launching the new rurality tier search tool. We also completed the RHC business and operations assessment with the vendor Oasys and began long term planning. In the program integrity area, all Corrective Action Plans are still within the 90-day target for completion, and 50 appeals were resolved, while 27 new appeals were received. RHC successfully closed the FY2020 filing window which had been extended to June 30th as part of the COVID-19 response measures. As part of our outreach, we posted multiple resources to assist applicants in submitting FY2020 forms, while navigating the new FCC Orders related to COVID-19. As part of the implementation of the FCC's COVID-19 Telehealth Program (outside USF) RHC processed almost 5,000 FCC Forms 460 out of the over 10,000 submissions. The FCC has subsequently declared the close of the filing window for the Program, as it has committed its \$200m target funds.

In the third quarter, the focus will be on implementing the requirements from multiple FCC Orders, developing a long term strategy based on the findings from the business and operations assessment, completing workable FY 2019 funding requests, implementing any prioritization required, processing FY20 funding requests, and reviewing FY21 competitive bidding forms.

RHC Program Updates & Accomplishments:

- *Operations* RHC Operations continued issuing FY 2019 commitments and closed the FY20 filing window.
- My Portal Modifications RHC/IT released the second batch of My Portal changes related to Order FCC 19-78 in July and completed the requirements and a majority of the development for a release in Q3.

Available for Public Use

- Appeals RHC received 27 new appeals in Q2 2020 and resolved 50 appeals.
- *Eligibility* RHC continued processing additional eligibility submissions due to new FCC Orders. Staff also reviewed eligibility requests to help FY 2021 applicants prepare to submit competitive bidding forms.
- *Procedures* RHC worked with FCC to update procedures and received FCC approval for FY 2020 funding request review procedures.
- *Outreach* RHC worked with stakeholders to get feedback on rates database and associated guides and tip sheets.
- Business and Operations Assessment RHC will work on developing a long term strategy for the program and its information technology systems based on the completed assessment.
- Reform Order RHC launched the new database of rural and urban rates and deployed new functionality in My Portal to meet new rules.

Planned Activities for Q3 2020:

- FY 2017 and 2018 Funding Requests As non-workable funding requests remaining from FY 2017 and FY 2018 become workable, they will be advanced through the review process.
- FY 2019 Funding Requests RHC will continue to focus on processing FY 2019 funding requests with the goal of completing all workable commitments.
- FY 2020 Funding Requests RHC will begin processing FY 2020 funding requests.
- Business and Operations Assessment RHC will finalize the long term strategy for its systems and operations.
- Employee Engagement RHC's management team will review the results for the engagement survey and update the management action plan as needed.


